Jay Larsen, a five-time Boston Marathon qualifier and longtime Prairie Striders race volunteer, was selected as the 2021 Harvey Mills Friend of Running presented by Prairie Striders Running Club.

Larsen, who also is the club's treasurer, was honored after the Prairie Striders Indoor 5K Jan. 23 at the Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex on the SDSU campus. Larsen, of Brookings, also is co-director of the Indoor 5K. The seasoned runner has given back to the sport as a race official, or volunteer at countless road races, track and cross country

meets. He was a co-director of the Minnesota AAU State Track and Field Meet.

Matt Bien, Brookings Marathon race director, said Larsen has been a Brookings Marathon volunteer for many years. Bien observed, "Jay is always willing to share his time—from tail bike to corner volunteer to finish line assistant—he has contributed to the Brookings Marathon in so many ways. He understands the importance of giving back to the sport of running as a volunteer."

Larsen was nominated by three people, one of whom commented, "If there is a road race, cross country meet or track meet, Jay will be there!"

Group run to encourage new runners

The focus of this year's group run will be people who are just figuring what the sport is all about.

Prairie Striders members Nancy Scholl and John Blatchford are leading a "walk to 5K" group for people who have had some activity base but aren't runners. In addition to this group, it is hoped that seasoned runners will join the effort for camaraderie and assistance.

Scholl said, "We are planning to organize a couple of runs per week that could serve as a portion of the training plan for individuals preparing to run their first 5K. Also, we will be inviting anyone who wants to join us intermittently for the group run. We will not be developing any training plans or coaching, but we will suggest a training format where participants walk/run three times per week.

"We are thinking of acting as accountability partners to participants and checking-in with them during the group run to see how they are doing with the rest of their training while also encouraging cross-training."

The runs are slated to begin May 3 at Dakota Nature Park. Participants should meet at the main entrance of the Brookings County Outdoor Adventure Center. Runs will be at 5:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Larsen was a competitive distance runner for more than 55 years and competed in Prairie Striders events for 46 years. Longtime race director Steve Britzman said Larsen always made a point to thank organizers for putting on an event.

In addition to qualifying for and completing the Boston Marathon, his 13 finishes in the Jack 15 Road Race ranks ninth all-time

In charge of electronic timing

Larsen's crowning achievement in 2021 was leading the charge to get the club an electronic timing system.

"It was Jay's initiative and research that brought the club to the point of buying an electronic timing system, which successfully debuted at the Bob Bartling Hobo Day 5K Oct. 23. Jay spent hours contacting vendors and studying systems to make a recommendation. Then he spent many more hours learning the system and testing it so it could be used at one of the club's major races within a few weeks of getting the system.

"Of course, he also was hands-on at race day to run the system," noted club president Dave Graves.

Since 2013, he has served as club treasurer and membership director. Britzman noted, "Jay has continued the excellent efforts of former Prairie Striders Treasurer Bob Bartling in managing Prairie Striders finances with the sound financial principles he honed as director of financial aid at South Dakota State University over a career of 33 years (1980-2013)."

52 years as high school official

Larsen also serves on the Brookings Park and Recreation Board and officiates football, basketball and baseball.

At the 2019 state championship football game at SDSU's Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium, Larsen was presented the Doug Koester Award by the South Dakota High School Officials Association. Named after the late Pierre official, the Koester Award recognizes the contributions officials make to high school sports and their community. Larsen has been a high school official since 1970, when he started officiating football and basketball in Minnesota.

He continued officiating when he moved to South Dakota in 1977, so the 2021 season marked his 52nd year of officiating.

Larsen has recruited and mentored more than 90 officials by working with college students who had an interest in officiating. He also served as a regional football officiating coordinator for many years.

The list of volunteer activities for Larsen is as long as his officiating resume.

Since 1981, he has been the scoreboard operator/timer for SDSU football and men's basketball games as well as working at Summit League Championships. He also is a certified official with USA Track and Field and volunteers with Special Olympics, Boys & Girls Club, the Michael J. Entringer Scholarship Classic and area youth sports and college events.

Larsen and his wife of 46 years, Kathy, have two children, Jennifer and Katie, and four grandchildren.

The Friend of Running Award was named after Mills in 2021 following his death in 2020. Mills was a longtime club member, an accomplished runner and major contributor to the club's 2018–19 scholarship drive.

Marathon hopeful to leave **COVID** in the dust

After two years of successfully outrunning COVID-19, this year's Brookings Marathon is looking for a new racing companion — normalcy.

Look for a mass start, optional masks and a full field.

For the marathon, I'm mostly hoping for a return to normalcy. "We are on track for a good turnout," race director Matt Bien said of the 53rd running of the Brookings Marathon, which is May 14. "Currently (Feb. 27) we're at 118 in the full, 214 in the half, and 30 relay teams. These numbers are ahead of our typical pre-pandemic registrations at this point in the year.

"I anticipate that the relay will fill by end March (capped at 50) and the half by end March/early April (capped at 400). We're hoping to break 150 for the full (capped at 300; 1569 finishers in 2021).

Registration is through raceroster.com.

Returning from a two-year COVID break is the Scotty Roberts 5K, which will be run Friday, May 13, on a new course that starts and finishes at Pioneer Park.

Packet pickup for Saturday races will again take place at the park — 4 to 8 p.m. Friday and 5:30 to 6:30 a.m. Saturday.

The race committee is also moving forward with plans for a post-race celebration at The 9 Bar/Cubby's restaurant in downtown Brookings after the race, similar to the 50-year post-race celebration in 2019.

"Supply chain disruptions have affected our lead times and product availability to some degree, but we fortunately started our ordering early and are working through all of that. We're hoping to launch a new webstore for marathon apparel with plans to have that open for pre-orders by mid-March. Product pickup will be on race weekend," Bien said.



But that alone was not enough to win the meet for the Jacks. SDSU and USD were tied 167 points going into the final event — the 4 x 400-meter relay. SDSU's team of Manny Phoulom-Smith, Pierre Lear, Thailan Hallman and Reid Pierzinski finished third, scoring six points. USD's team finished fifth for four

SDSU claims its second indoor crown in four years — 173 to 171.

Scholarship recipient looks to improve lofty marks

Coach Rod DeHaven struck recruiting gold with the men's distance runners he brought in for fall 2018 and one of those nuggets is Joseph Minor-Williams, who is the 2021-22 recipient of the Prairie Striders/Phil LaVallee Memorial Scholarship.

Four seasons into their SDSU adventure, most of the original group of eight are still on the team and are scoring points. Joining Minor-Williams, a graduate of Washburn High School in Minneapolis, as current Jackrabbits are Tom Breuckman, Ben Olson, Blake Iverson and Daniel Burkhalter.

"Now, looking at the team scoring, it's Ben Olson, me, Tom and Daniel. It's all the older guys that I came in with, so that's awesome to see. Now we're exceling at a high level. We're able

to be competitive nationally while being competitive with each other still," Minor-Williams said.

The other dominant SDSU men's runner is Gabe Peters, a year senior to the 2018 class.

During this year's indoor season, four of them have put their names in the school's top-10 registry. Olson claimed the school mark in the 3K (8:04.17) and is third in the 5K (14:12.41).

Minor-Williams is second in the 5K (14:12.33) and eighth in the 3K (8:15.91) while Peters is ninth in the 3K (8:16.99) and eighth in the 5K (14:25.38). Burkhalter is seventh in the 3K (8:15.20) and eighth in the 800 (1:52.39).

Mixing fun with hard work

Minor-Williams said the group has a camaraderie that feels like family. "Running is a big aspect, but we realize we're friends even without the running. It's awesome to hang out with each other and play video games or whatever and have fun and enjoy our time together. It's been a lot of fun enjoying my teammates.

"We go out on runs and joke around, during workouts we joke around, sometimes talk until it gets too hard. We work hard and still have fun with it," Minor-Williams said.

He said he felt those bonds when he was a visiting SDSU as a high school senior.

"I liked he team when I visited. I remember telling my mom after the visit, I think this is the place," said Minor-Williams, who added he also was influenced by having an Olympian for a coach and following in the steps of Micah Mather, a Twin Cities recruit two years ahead of Minor-Williams. "It seemed like a good fit."

Looking back, he knows he made the right choice.

"My Jackrabbit experience has been really amazing. I've really enjoyed being here. The town has grown on me a lot. It feels like a close-knit community. The school is small enough that everybody isn't just a number, everybody has a place," Minor-Williams said.

Teammate success brings confidence

For the journalism major that place has been at the front of the pack. Coming to SDSU, he had goals of winning

a conference race and qualifying for a regional meet.

In his first season, he ran varsity and competed with the team at Midwest Region Cross Country Championship. In the spring of his freshman year (2019), he had hit another goal, winning the Summit League 5K in 14:34.98 and finishing second in the 10K in 31:23.03. The performance earned him the Newcomer of the Year Award.

He has continued to shave time in all his events in succeeding years.

"I just hate losing ... (and) I'm really competitive with people I know; there's a little bit more at stake. Also I want to improve my times. Seeing Ben Olson run 14:13 (at Ole Miss), I thought I can probably run that time. So I went into Drake (two weeks later), 14:13 is the goal. Seeing how everybody else does and knowing we all train together, we all train together, we're all right there, means I know I can run at that same level." he said.

At Drake, he ran a 14:08.40 to finish seventh and place seventh on the SDSU record board.

Setting major goals for swan song

For the 2022 outdoor season, he has even bigger goals — set school records in 5K and 10K, "which we think is doable while helping out my teammates by making sure I'm on (targeted time) every single race to make sure they're on (targeted time) every race." The current school marks are 13:42.82 (Josh Yeager, 2021) and 28:55.84 (Joel Reichow, 2016).

For the cross country season, Minor-Williams would like to see the Jacks place one through six at the Summit League championship as they did in 2019. He called that the highlight of his SDSU career. "Everyone put in their best effort. To sweep conference and score 15 points ... the bus ride home was so fun, everybody was happy," he said.

The 2022-23 seasons will be his last as a Jackrabbit.

Minor-Williams plans to graduate next May and "if running goes alright, I would love to go back to Minneapolis and join Minnesota Distance Elite and run for my high school coach" while also pursuing a career as a film reviewer.
